








Acknowledgement of Country

College Prayer


Dear God,







Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE)



Year 11

Semester One - Unit 1 (5 Subjects, English and Religion is compulsory) Semester Two - Unit 2 ((5 Subjects, English and Religion is compulsory)

Assessment:

- Coursework is ongoing and assessed
- School Assessed Coursework (SAC) and School Assessed Tasks (SATs) are created and set by the school and the grade/score is reported on semester report
- S or N is reported to the VCAA for each subject (Study) in Unit 1 and in Unit 2
- Internal Exams at the end of the year (Unit 1 and Unit 2)
- Minimum of 90% attendance




Year 12

Semester One - Unit 3 (5 Subjects, English/EAL is compulsory) Semester Two - Unit 4 (5 Subjects, English/EAL is compulsory)

Assessment:

Two separate decisions reported to the VCAA:


- S or N based on evidence collated on the completion and understanding of coursework completed in class
- Level of achievement in all SACs and SATs completed in Unit 3 & 4
- The SAC/SAT scores go towards a student's Study Score (50) in the Subject/Study
- Minimum of 90% attendance



Key Points on assessment...


A variety of assessment types can be used in Units 1 & 2, however in Units 3 & 4 assessment is based on:

- School Assessed Coursework (SAC)under test conditions and contribute to the Study Score
- School Assessed Tasks (SAT)
- External Examinations (generally worth 50-66% of overall result - study Score)
- General Achievement Test (Wednesday 15 July, 2023)
- Practice Exams in Term 4 compulsory for all students completing used to help teacher judgement when providing Indicative Grades



Absence from a SAC?

- If a student is absent on the day the SAC, a letter will be sent to parents as a SMS
- Absent for any assessed work MUST have a medical certificate. Notes from home will not be sufficient documentation unless endorsed by the Senior School Learning Leader as a legitimate reason for the absence. If the absence is not Explained and Approved, then students will not receive a grade for their Scored SAC.
- If the absence is approved by the Senior School Learning Leader the student will be required to sit the SAC in a catch up after school on Tuesday in Room 1. This will normally occur within one week of the original date; however, students may negotiate longer with the Senior School Learning Leader. The task will be graded by the teacher. Two opportunities are available to complete catch up.
- If a student is absent from a SAC and the absence is approved, but the student does not attend the opportunity provided to catch up on Thursday after school they will receive a 0% score.
- Teachers will be required to make modifications to SACs completed outside of class time to avoid students accessing questions from students who've already completed the assessment.
- If the Assessment Task is a Folio or SAT, then students need to organise to submit the work before the due date or as soon as possible after the due date and supply a medical certificate for their absence.




This process upholds the integrity of the VCE assessment process and is in line with the VCAA Assessment Guidelines.


Snapshot of what it looks like...note the week(s) and number of assessments... hence, why planning it important.


Support available at school

- Make contact with the school




Stress

- •How do they perceive VCE?








Signs of Distress

Year 11 & 12 need to Research Options


- Pandemic has shown us we can be resilient and adaptable
